That one company could have eliminated all of that cancer care debt, and still made six billion dollars in profit. Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. It is the cornerstone of the Jubilee year.

Of course, people are indebted to each other in different ways -they don't all have to be financial. The use of time to care for a person, or running errands, or childcare. We can keep mental score sheets on just about anything. Imagine, if they were to be released, just one day disappear. Imagine the relief. Imagine the joy. Imagine the grace. Imagine the true feeling of forgiveness.


